did	Did he win the Champions league last year?
	Did she marry last year?
	What team did he/she play for last year?

VARIATIONS (to make it a bit more difficult):

- The person you choose must be dead.
- The questions can only have two possible answers: **yes** or **no**.
- Set a limit for the number of questions before guessing the hidden name.
