

The European Union

Level: 3º E.S.O.

Grammar: *Present Perfect. Contrast Present Perfect / Past Simple. Time expressions: just, ever, how long, etc.*

Functions: *Talking about experiences. Doing a survey.*

Vocabulary: *Linkers: **after that, later**, etc. Countries and nationalities.*

Phonetics: *Pronunciation of **have**.*

In this unit students will read about the history of the European Union and some facts about the country members: their names, flags, monuments, capitals..

They will practise the use of the Present Perfect to talk about experiences and learn how to use some words like “yet”, “already”, “ever” and “how long” and their place in the sentence. The order of paragraphs in a text will also be practised. As regarding vocabulary, they will learn the difference between the name of countries and nationalities while learning some facts about the EU countries.

Remind your students to use the grammar and glossary buttons when necessary.

The structure of the unit is as follows:

PART 1 - The European Union

1. Drag the name: In this exercise, students must drag the names of the countries in the map into the correct place.

2. Flags: Next, students must first look at the screen and try to memorize the names of the countries the flags represent. After 15 seconds, the names of the countries will disappear and the students must write them in the blanks. They must have a score of 50% at least to go on automatically to the exercise. If their score is worse than that, they will be given another chance.

3. The European Union: Here, students must drag the numbers to the corresponding box to tidy up the paragraphs in a text about the European Union.

PART 2 - A Survey

1. A survey - Listening: This is a listening exercise. When you click on the stereo icon you will listen to a dialogue between a woman doing an interview and Paul.

2. Listening comprehension: This is a set of three multiple-choice exercises with questions about the previous dialogue. If students can't give the correct answers they will have a second chance but now with the help of the audio part. If they fail again they

will have a last chance and now they will be able to see the script of the dialogue. If they are not able to answer correctly, then the solutions will appear on the screen.

3. Record the dialogue: Next, students must choose on the two characters of the dialogue (the interviewer or Paul) and record their part in their own voices. The “text” button allows them to hide the reading text. When they have finished all the recordings they push the “Run” button to listen to the complete dialogue.

PART 3 - Paul's list

1. Check the list: This is a writing exercise, students here must write sentences saying which things Paul has done and which he hasn't done yet, using the present perfect tense. If they can't give the correct answer they can click on the key icon to see the solution.

2. Word order: Next, students must tidy up the words in the sentences by dragging them to the correct place. They must start by placing the first word of the sentence, then the second, and so on.

3. Choose the question: In this exercise, students must read the sentence given and choose the matching question.

PART 4 - Words

1. Match the expressions with their meaning: In this exercise, students must match the expressions with their meaning joining them with an arrow.

2. Fill in the blanks: Next, they must write the nationality in the white squares trying to remember the expressions learnt in the previous exercise.

3. Pronunciation: This is a recording exercise on the pronunciation of "have" in the present perfect. First they must listen to the model sentence and record it. After that they can compare their pronunciation with the original. They can repeat the recording as many times as they like until they feel satisfied with their production.

PART 5 - Games

1. Crossword: Here, students must read the definitions and drag the letters into the correct places. If they press the check button, all the solutions will appear on the screen: the correct letters will turn blue, and the wrong ones will be replaced by the right letters in red.

2. Memory game: In the last exercise of the unit, students must find pairs of European countries and their capital cities in this memory game.
